SOLITUDE

→ Physical separation from others

INTIMACY

 Relationship between individuals caused by seclusion

ANONYMITY

→ Desire for public privacy

RESERVE

→ Psychological barrier against unwanted intrusion

Privacy and Freedom (1967)

Privacy is not **Anonymity**.

Privacy is to keep information and actions to yourself or others selectively, but others knowing you are involved.

- → Locking your office door during a private meeting
- Encrypting an email sent to specific individuals

Anonymity is to release information and actions to others without your identity attached.

- Blowing the whistle on a company
- Using a pseudonym and posting items for the public

→ Analytics can pinpoint using various statistics

"EVERYONE USES IT"

→ While everyone may use it, not everyone lives in the same place

"NOTHING TO HIDE"

→ Free speech, but nothing to say





PRISM 2007


→ Collects stored communications based on demands under Section 702 of the FISA Amendments Act of 2008

XKEYSCORE 2013

→ Secret computer system from the NSA that continually searches and analyzes global Internet data

社会信用体系 2009

→ Known as the **Social Credit System**, a national credit rating and blacklist developed by the government of the People's Republic of China

Documents have shown that these countries **intentionally spy** on one another's citizens and **share the information**

What can I do?

DON'T PANIC

- → Almost everyone uses analytics, and there are good cases for usage
- → A free service does not always mean you are the product
- → Common Internet sense can go a long way toward increasing privacy

CREATE A THREAT MODEL

- → What **threat** matters to you?
- → What do you have that's worth protecting?
- → Who are you protecting it **from**?
- → How much effort are you willing to put in?



CHECK YOUR BROWSER

- → Most browsers have settings to assist in stopping or assist in anonymizing tracking
- → Trusted add-ons are available to provide further protection such as **uBlock Origin**, **ClearURLs**, and more
- Assume that no browser is inherently private by default
- → Takes just a few minutes to check quick settings



LIMIT SOCIAL MEDIA USE

- → The more you post publicly, the more everyone knows about you
- → Services like Facebook and Twitter use everything you give them
- → Fun quizzes can be used to harvest your information
- → Uploaded pictures contain EXIF information that can include your location
- → Limiting use is easy, but even better is deleting your accounts and not using it at all



AUDIT YOUR ACCOUNTS

- → Check your commonly used accounts and audit your privacy settings
- → Use different passwords for every account you have
- → Use multi-factor authentication where available
- → Sign up for **Have I Been Pwned** to help audit breached accounts
- → This can take a bit of time depending on how thorough you want to be

USE ENCRYPTED EMAIL

- → Gmail, Outlook, Yahoo!, and other common email providers are not considered private and encrypted by default
- → Email providers such as ProtonMail, Tutanota, and Mailbox.org take privacy seriously
- → Switching email providers entirely can take significant time and effort
- → Other options to secure existing providers are available such as Pretty Good Privacy (PGP) but may not be user friendly

USE ENCRYPTED MESSAGING

- → Facebook Messenger, Snapchat, WhatsApp, and more are **not** encrypted
- → Apps such as Signal and Session are developed with privacy in mind and encrypt everything
- → Convincing family and friends to switch with you can be an impossible feat

AVOID BIG TECH

- → Avoid products from Alphabet (Google), Amazon, Apple, Meta (Facebook), and Microsoft
- → Consider using open alternatives such as LibreOffice, CryptPad, Firefox, and more
- → A near impossible task, especially when many sites and services actively rely on Big Tech for their own



USE TOR

- → A volunteer relay network containing over 6,000 relays
- → Assists in concealing your location and usage from anyone performing network surveillance
- → Various utilities connect to Tor, including Tor Browser, Orbot, Onion Browser, and more
- → Tor is not the end all be all of privacy tools
