



Get 'Em While They're (Still) Hot!

<u>Starting June 4</u>, New Feature DVDs will be checked out for 1 week. A shorter loan period will make wait times shorter for new films. DVDs that are not classified as New Features will continue to have a loan period of 3 weeks.

Maximum amount of DVDs borrowed will now be 5

Decreasing the amount of borrowed DVDs borrowed at one time will also give more Bellwood Library patrons the opportunity to borrow the DVDs of their choice. Adults and children's cards will have the same limits. If you are used to placing holds on large numbers of DVDs, you may want to place fewer holds and use the "My Lists" feature in the catalog to keep track of what you want to see.



The Library has notaries public on staff. Please call us at 708-547-7393, ext. 4 to make sure a notary is available at the time you plan to come. We will notarize most documents except real estate and immigration documents. This service is **free**. Please bring your government-issued identification and documents. All signers must make a personal appearance before the notary at the time of notarization.
