From the Director By Amy Crump

As I near the six-month mark of serving as the Director at Bellwood Library, I am pleased with the status of our biggest project thus far: developing a strategic plan.

"If you don't know where you are going, any road will take you there." This saying, attributed to Lewis Carroll, sums up why the library administration decided to develop a strategic plan. In order to serve the Bellwood community well, we need to know where the

community would like us to be!

A strategic plan will help us do even better what we already do so well. Excellence must be defined locally. It is imperative to have community input for strategic planning. A Community Survey was available on our website for several weeks.

On May 8, our Strategic Planning Consultant Amanda Standerfer hosted a day of focus groups at the library. Maybe you took part in one. The focus groups allowed us to gather stakeholders' and citizens' views for consideration.

Over the summer, both the Library Board and the library staff will participate in separate half-day retreats, learning about what the community told us and moving forward in the next step of the planning process – developing goals and activities to meet those goals.

We anticipate that the proposed plan will be presented to the Library Board by September for approval, giving us enough time to work on an implementation process for January 2020.

We appreciate all the input the community has made and look forward to serving you even better as a result!


