



Those of us at the library have been involved in several projects in the past 19 months, even during our closed period. For one thing, we completed a replacement of our 60-year-old boiler with a complete new energyefficient HVAC system. (No more freezing in the meeting room!) I

We also spent quite a bit of time scanning the historical Board records. For those of you who are like me and geek out reading about the history of a place, you can now see Board Meeting minutes all the way from the first meeting in 1932! Finally, I am thrilled to announce that just in time for the library's 90th anniversary, the Bellwood Board of Trustees have approved a \$1.9 million renovation and modernization of the library in 2022. As part of the library's Strategic Plan which began in 2020, the Trustees and staff identified building renovations as a priority, based on input from community focus groups. The current building was built in 1960 and the renovation will provide the Bellwood community with updated library spaces. We hope that this will be a welcomed gift to the community.
