This year, the end of Summer will be bittersweet for us.
Joyce Evans, our longest serving staff member in the history of our Library, will retire. While we are so grateful for all that Miss Joyce has given to our Library over the years, we will miss her friendship, creativity, laughter, silly voices and above all, her passion for literacy, especially for our youth. Joyce started at our Library in our circulation department in 1997, soon after



our building was erected in its current place. She moved to the children's department in 2005, where she focused on children's programming and library collections. Most importantly, Miss Joyce made sure that every child knew that reading is fun. In the Children's department, she has hosted 884 Family Evening Storytimes, planned and conducted 17 Summer Reading and Book Camp Programs, provided countless programs throughout the school years and touched the lives of countless families in our community. We will miss seeing Miss Joyce every day, but we know that she's out there somewhere, wearing a silly hat or costume, just for old time's sake. In all seriousness, we know that she will continue to share the passion she has for reading with everyone she meets. Thank you for your incredible service to our Library and our community, Joyce!



Bikelangelo, our book bike\*, will be officially rolling out this summer. We are so excited to bring our library to you by setting up at popular locations around Chatham.      Receive a virtual ticket to enter a raffle for a gift card of your choice after every book read, and be automatically entered into a grand prize drawing.

Now is the perfect time to update your passport! Passport agents from the Sangamon County Circuit Clerk's office will process passport applications from 9:00 a.m. to noon Saturday, July 16. Standard passport fees will apply, and applicants should receive their passports within 4 - 6 weeks. If interested in obtaining a passport, please bring the following:

- Certified copy of your birth certificate and/or expired passport (no photocopies)
- Valid photo ID
- Approved passport photo (For \$10.00, they can provide you with a passport photo)
- Certified copies of court orders for name change, custody or adoption decrees
- Two checks or money orders to pay applicable fees
