Bouncing Back! Improving Workforce Development Grant

The Library was awarded an American Rescue Plan Act grant for over \$11,000 to help our local workforce bounce back from the pandemic. As part of that grant's funds, the library has purchased new databases, will be hosting job searching and small business classes throughout the year, will start a new leadership book discussion group, and will create kits to aid in meeting technological needs beyond the library's walls.



2021 AARP Tax Help Update



file name the scanner will produce a view of the original photo, an enhanced view and the back of the photo in about three seconds.
