Gonzales looks deeply into the mental processes that enable us to cope with the trauma that often sets in during and after a challenge to our survival. Gonzales narrates tales of survivors who have suffered war and terrorism as well as falls off mountains and into choppy surf. Those who adapt well to the post-traumatic stress share points in common. Survivors of traumatic events often do not recover without help from others, and this book is an education for those wishing to be of use in a stressful, often frightening world. Drawing on gripping cases across a wide range of life-threatening experiences, the author fashions a compelling argument about fear, courage, and the adaptability of the human spirit.
